## Session 10—The Problem of Evil

## I. God's Blessings on Good Job (Job 1:1–15)

## A. Job's godly character (1:1, 2, 4, 5)

Job's inward fear of God defined his upward relationship with God and strengthened his outward testimony before the world.

### B. Job's tremendous wealth (1:3)

God blessed Job, making him the wealthiest, most influential man in Kedar.

#### II. Job's External Trial (Job 1:6–22)

#### A. Job's losses (1:6–19)

Job lost nearly all his possessions, financial assets, and means of livelihood.

## B. Job's response to loss (1:20–22)

Job showed his deep, genuine faith in God when he began to worship the Lord.

Job recognized God in His sovereignty takes and gives as He deems best.

God's sovereign plan never violates His perfect character.

## III. Job's Physical Trial (Job 2:1–10)

## A. Job's disease (2:1–8)

Job suffered from painful sores that covered his body.

# B. Job's wife's response: Curse God (2:9)

Job's wife encouraged Job to do what Satan wanted him to do all along—"Curse God, and die!"

# C. Job's response: Trust God (2:10)

Job trusted God for Who God is rather than for what God gives him.

The same grace that saves us from our sins sustains us and helps us trust God when life gets hard.
